East Mediterranean Gas Forum formally established with headquarters in Egypt (English Ahram)

The establishment of the Forum comes amid tensions in the Eastern Mediterranean over Ankara's hunt for gas in violation of the territorial waters of Greece and Cyprus. Read more here.

Stronger joint efforts needed to achieve cleaner Mediterranean (EEA)

Achieving a cleaner Mediterranean Sea requires better implementation of policies and enhanced environmental data and information, according to a joint report by the European Environment Agency (EEA) and United Nations Environment Programme's Mediterranean Action Plan (UNEP/MAP), published today. Cumulative effects of waste and marine litter, and wastewater and industrial emissions remain key challenges for the region. Read more here.

Climate: risks and future strategies in Italy (EurekAlert)

It could be worth up to 8% of GDP per capita, exacerbate the differences between north and south, between society's rich and poor, as well as affect a number of Italy's strategic sectors: climate change is a risk accelerator for many aspects of both the economy and society. The report, "Analisi del rischio. I cambiamenti climatici in Italia – Risk Analysis. Climate Change in Italy" has been published.
