Macron's Government Suffers First Defeat in Parliament after Election Setback (France24)

France's government has suffered its first defeat in parliament after President Emmanuel Macron's ruling party lost its majority in elections last month. Read more <u>here</u>.

For nearly 3,000 years, ancient Egypt flourished as the preeminent civilization in the Mediterranean world. Read more here.


Quarry Discovered Under Ancient Church in Jerusalem (Archaeology)
